Kids Helping Kids FAQs

Can my organization pack our own kits?

Unfortunately due to health and safety concerns we cannot allow groups to pack their own kits. The kits are packaged and vacuum sealed before arriving to the hospital.

Will we be able to choose the hospital the kits are sent to?

We welcome suggestions, but we can't guarantee that they will go to a particular hospital. Hospitals may have their own items to give out, or may not think the kits are a good fit for their particular facility. In order to supply the kits, we have to have a contact within the hospital. If you can help us form a connection with a hospital that we're not already serving, we would happily introduce them to Comfort Kits.

Can my group deliver kits to the hospital?

This will vary depending on the hospital. Some hospitals may let your group deliver to the hospital but not directly to the children; it's up to each facility.

Why should we raise money for Comfort Kits instead of money for treatments/research?

Comfort Kits is a unique product that primarily helps to comfort and reassure hospitalized children during difficult treatments and procedures. Over the years we have received feedback from parents and hospital staff that Comfort Kits have turned thousands of children's tears to smiles, worries to joy, and fears to relief. We believe that those expressions alone help to support and encourage the total care of children.
